MINUTES OF A MEETING OF LAPWORTH PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 14th January 2008 AT LAPWORTH VILLAGE HALL, OLD WARWICK ROAD, LAPWORTH AT 7.30PM

2. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

No interests were declared relating to matters included on the agenda.

3.a WARWICHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL EMERGENCY PLAN

Mick Potter, Assistant Manager of the Emergency Planning Unit gave an interesting presentation in relation to the work of the Emergency Planning Unit and the role of the Parish Council, and use of the Emergency Plan.

3.b PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SESSION

Councillor Polgreen left the meeting.

Mrs Charlotte Jay and other representatives from the SLOWeR 40 Campaign Group were in attendance. Mrs Jay advised the Parish Council of a meeting she had had with Carolyn Burrows, Senior Safety Engineer WCC, who had carried out the technical review of the speed limit on the Old Warwick Road. The recommendation of the review to reduce the speed limit from 60 mph to 50 mph was purely based on technical data and did not take into consideration the number of accidents and public views. Mrs Jay felt the meeting had been very productive and that Carolyn Burrows would support proposals to further reduce the speed limit to 40mph in certain sections. The ideal outcome for campaigners of the SLOWeR 40 group would be to see the entire stretch reduced to 40mph and that the 30mph zone be extended from village to past the Boot Public House.

In view of the members of the public wishing to attend for item 13(a) Speed Limit Review Old Warwick Road it was agreed to consider that item as a priority.

13.a Speed Limit Review Old Warwick Road

The Parish Council discussesd at length the proposal to reduce the speed limit from 60mph to 50mph on the Old Warwick Road to Hockley Heath. Consideration was given to the input and proposals from the SLOWeR 40 group. The Parish Council did not believe it was feasible to have some stretches at 50 and others at 40mph as this would cause confusion and a proliferation of road signs.

The view of the Parish Council was that there should be a 40mph speed limit from Hockley Heath to the junction with Lapworth Street at which point the speed limit should be reduced to 30mph and extend until it meets the current 30mph limit at the start of the village.

It was agreed to put this proposal in response the County Council. Clerk to Action
