Warwick District Local Plan – The Parish Council's agreed response to the consultation а. had been submitted. A District Council meeting scheduled to consider the Local Plan had been put back to 23rd April 2014. A number of proposals in relation to the options for Gypsy and Traveller sites were now being considered by the District Council - none were in Lapworth. The closest proposed site was by the Shell Garage in Hatton.

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL 9.

C Clir Compton advised that following a 10 hour meeting a Council Tax increase of a. 1.99% had been agreed by the County Council. This had been agreed against a backdrop of an increase in adult social care and looked after children and no further cuts in hours or closures of the Waste Recycling sites and libraries. Extra money had been allocated to flooding issues. Budget savings of £92 million was still necessary over the next 4 years and 600 redundancies were envisaged.

A glowing peer review of the County's Fire and Rescue Service had been received. Response times, for both urban and rural calls, were at approximately 8 minutes.
