# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF LAPWORTH PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 12<sup>th</sup> July 2010 AT LAPWORTH VILLAGE HALL, OLD WARWICK ROAD, LAPWORTH AT 7.30 PM.

#### 1. APOLOGIES

Cllr Corney (Vice Chairman), Cllr Cox, Cllr Caborn arrived during item 8 on the agenda

#### 2. **DECLARATION OF INTERESTS**

- a. No update to the register of interests were declared
- b. No personal interests in items on the agenda declared.
- c. No prejudicial interests in items on the agenda declared.

#### 3. PUBLIC OPEN FORUM –

Simon Ellershaw, Group Manager of Warwick Area Risk Team, of the Fire Service was present in response to concerns raised by the Parish Council regarding an incident whereby emergency response vehicles had become trapped on impassable roads causing delays in accessing properties. Mr David Hayward who had raised the initial concern was also present.

Mr Ellershaw said that all residents in the area who may be affected had been written to advising them that in the case of an emergency clear directions including Tapster Lane, Copt Green off Bushwood Lane, in addition to the postcode. The Fire Services database had been updated to reflect the impassable routes in order to prevent a similar occurrence.

Mr Ellernshaw stressed that prevention was the best route and advised that free home safety checks were available and free fire alarms would be fitted if necessary. Details were circulated.

#### 8. WARWICK DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Caborn discussed a range of options the District Council were exploring to meet the anticipated budget deficit – these included a thorough review of services to using lean systems processes and the potential for a shared management team with Stratford District Council.

Range of options to save money including lean systems and joined up management

- f. **Discretionary Travel Questionnaire** Only £23,000 of the £85,000 available for taxi/travel tokens had been claimed and the District Council was reviewing as to how best the resources could be spent. Questionnaires to be displayed at the Post Office.
