17/11/3 **Dispensations** – no dispensation requests received

17/11/4 **Public Participation –** There were a number of representatives from a meeting that had been held at the Punch Bowl in relation to crime in Lapworth. The meeting had been attended by over 70 residents and it was claimed that there was considerable depth of feeling and concern in the community about a perceived epidemic of car-crime, break-ins, and personal intimidation. Concerns were exacerbated by the availability of information on social media and the reported comment by a police employee that neither preventative patrolling nor effective follow up on theft is practicable and that current police focus is on other areas than Lapworth.

Two options were put forward as suggestions by the public representatives:

One was to raise the profile of Lapworth's concerns through official channels – the Warwickshire Chief Constable, the Police Commissioner, WCC, the Warwick Rural West Community Forum and to seek advice from the Police in relation to preventative measures.

Secondly there had been a groundswell of opinion at the meeting held in the Punchbowl that some form of private security arrangement should be investigated and the Parish Council was asked whether it would support this in principal or with finance.

District Councillor Sue Gallagher encouraged all to write to police commissioner, as police services is largest part of council tax paid and advised that the next Warwick Rural West meeting is in March everyone can attend and there is always a Police representative.

Another meeting of residents was scheduled to be held Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November 7pm at Punch Bowl. All are welcome to attend

#### It was agreed that

1. a copy of minutes of the Parish Council meeting of 13<sup>th</sup> November would be sent to the Police Commissioner and Chief Constable advising that Lapworth PC supported the concerns raised in relation to crime in the area

- 2. further advice would be sought from the police in relation to preventative measures and awareness raising
- 3. Funding private security arrangements was not within the remit of the Parish Council.

#### 17/11/6 Reports for Information

#### a. Warwick District Council

Local Plan now approved and no judicial review, Executive has approved the proposal Country Park at Tachbrook – which would include a football stadium, shops, and schools

Mack Golf withdrawn from contract to run Newbold Golf Club and the course will close on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017. The District Council is suing Mack Golf for breach of contract, but it is unlikely the District will run it but options are being considered

### b. Warwickshire County Council

**Warwick Road Rowington to Lapworth** - The Clerk of Rowington Parish Council has asked to pursue the possible provision of a public footpath between Rowington & Lapworth along the Old Warwick Road. The Clerk had copied in Peter Hallam who has replied that he feels the current route from Rowington to Lapworth is acceptable and doubts that the Council could afford the necessary works.

**Wharf Lane Lapworth -** The issue of speeding in Wharf Lane has been taken further following the request from residents as discussed at the last PC meeting. The Cellular GPS data does not find a problem but the County are going to conduct a formal speeding check. The matter is being considered by Cllr John Horner and Cllr Cooke

# Warwick town centre and Stanks Island and Birmingham Road improvements begin with speed limit reduction

The improvements to Warwick town centre, identified after extensive consultation last year, are set to begin with the implementation of a 20mph zone. New 20mph road signs will be going up in the town over the coming weeks, followed in the New Year by infrastructure works designed to reduce speeds on Priory Road.

Other proposals that formed part of last year's consultation continue to be developed and include:

- Wider pavements
- New crossing points
- Improved cycle links
- Alterations at key town centre gateways such as the Northgate junction
- One-way routing along High Street / Jury Street and The Butts
- Priority signals for buses and reduced street clutter.

Advanced works to Stanks Island – which will be funded by the Government's Local Growth Fund through the Coventry and Warwickshire Local Enterprise Partnership (CWLEP) – and the Birmingham Road Improvement Scheme are also due to begin with new road signs reducing the speed limit along Birmingham Road.
