Ros Anscombe, Community Development Worker - Rural South Warwickshire, attended the meeting to promote the joint WCC/WDC Warwick Rural West Community Forum grant fund 2019-20 to the Parish Council and to members of the public attending the meeting.

There is £7,250 available in the community forum fund pot to support community projects in the Warwick Rural West area and the Forum is very keen for groups to know about this opportunity and apply. The application process is straightforward and examples of what has been funded previously to raise awareness of what can be applied for, see the forum webpage:

The fund launches on Monday 2 December 2019 and is open until 20th January 2020.

Recent events in Grove Lane prompted 17 representatives of local resident to attend the meeting.

The new owner explained:

- any concerns about Traveller involvement were misplaced
- his vision was to use the site to provide a fishing facility with luxury cabins for overnight accommodation
- the site would be a commercial venture for all to enjoy
- have disabled access
- provide opportunity for local employment.
- he anticipated the fishing lake would be 20 meters by 40 meters and was contacting the District Council to discuss a Planning Application.

Unfortunately the new owner was not able to stay to respond to questions from members of the public who flagged concerns as to:

- the haste of work to date, filling in of the pond and devastation of the meadow caused by the bulldozer which had been home to flora and fauna in recreational land and the Green Belt
- ancient hedgerows ripped out to put in place a new entrance without planning permission
- proposed installation of 'hard standings' which could be used for a variety of purposes

- flooding caused by the disturbance to the land
- that no planning application had been lodged with the District Council
- that could be part of incremental growth which could lead to further developments on the site, particularly if the Cricket Club were not to extend their lease
- the temporary Stop Notice provided by the District Council was due to expire at which time there was the potential for further activity

District Councillor Illingworth advised it was not possible to issue an extension to the Temporary Stop Notice and that there were no legal grounds for issuing a permanent one, and at this stage no breach of planning laws had been committed should retrospective planning permission be sought and granted.

Local residents were requested to report any unauthorised activity to the District Council via Councillor Henderson, tel 01564 783672

The Parish Council was asked to formally request the District Council to identify sites as promised in 2017 to accommodate travellers.

Fly Tipping

Residents of Lapworth have once again reported fly tipping. There have been problems with fly tipping in Wharf Lane for a number of years where there is an unofficial "lay-by" on the north side of the road approximately 75 metres west of Swallow Cruisers boatyard.

Around 12 black bin bags of rubbish were deposited at this site over the last week. This has already been reported to WDC.

This was sent to me as a County Councillor but fly tipping is a matter for WDC and should be reported to WDC Contract Services at contract.services@warwickdc.gov.uk

a. Village Hall Play Area/fencing improvements - Cllr Rees reported that the fencing had been replaced, one of the chains on the play equipment had come lose and been reported to Kompan.

Discussion regarding ensuring there was adequate access to the entrance. It was RESOLVED to paint hashing on the carpark to stop cars parking in front of the entrance.

Clirs Manley, Shales, Rees and Mace volunteered to carry out the work and Clir Shales would undertake to investigate/buy appropriate paint

- b. Indoor/outdoor sports contribution update The Section 106 funding of £12,740 to support indoor and outdoor sporting had now been received. £10,000 was for indoor sports and £2,740 for outdoor sports. Confirmation of the contribution to the table tennis had been received. Clerk to progress Table Tennis grant application and advertise more widely.
- c. Lapworth Train Station phone box ideas included advertising for local businesses, book exchange, plant exchange. Clerk to find out if permission is needed from Network Rail to move it and whether it is possible to relocate it to the Village Green by the Oaks. Cllr Esslemont to investigate options for moving the phone box. Should it be viable to move it consultation would be undertaken with residents at the Oaks.

- f. Gritting Routes Cllr Esselmont to ask Kevin Armstrong for a price. Clerk to ask WCC for a cost Chessetts Wood Road between Rising Lane and Darley Green Road

However a cost of £150 per board, for each of the six boards, would be needed for materials. It was suggested that featured businesses may contribute to the costs. Cllr Doyle to explore first phase to gauge interest
- h. Social media considerations Cllr Doyle, Cllr Henderson and Cllr Ludlow to meet within next three weeks to progress. Present a plan and a strategy to December meeting.

- I. Bakers Lane developments— Cllr Illingworth to meet District Council representative.
- m. Neighbourhood Plan Cllr Henderson had challenged why take up lower in Warwick than Stratford, response Stratford have more Parishes so greater percentage in Warwick. David Butler to attend January meeting, gauge interest and enthusiasm with a view to it being the main agenda item for the March Assembly. Review Parish Plan in Jan/Feb meeting.
