## 6. Reports for Information

### 6.1. Warwick District Council - D Cllr Illingworth

There are still funds available to help businesses and weather the Covid-19 Crisis. The schemes now include some businesses which were excluded from the first round and there are also discretionary grants available. Village Halls are eligible if you have not already been successful. Additionally the District Council will make grants to organisations (including parish councils) who have incurred extra costs in supporting the local community during the crisis. Cllr Richard Hales is the expert on all these various funds.

We are preparing for the reopening of indoor leisure centres and swimming pools as the restrictions there are being lifted in the next few weeks. Looking forward we are having discussions with Stratford District Council

There is an imminent consultation on extending the current Public Space Protection Order covering the District for alcohol to include all intoxicating substances. We are also looking at updating the Dog Control Orders and I have raised the issue of Play Areas owned by parish councils.

Exclusion of dogs can only be implemented when the area is fenced off which of course applies to Lapworth. I understand that they will be consulting parish councils to see if they wish to be included and whether there is anyone locally who could be given the necessary authority to enforce.

#### **WCC Social Distancing Traffic Proposals in Kenilworth**

Measures agreed by Warwickshire County Council, Warwick District Council and Kenilworth Town Council are being introduced in Kenilworth Town Centre to support the safe reopening of town centre businesses and encourage people to use their town centre.

The following measures are being introduced:

- A temporary 20mph speed limit is being introduced on The Square and Warwick Road between Abbey End and the gyratory at St Johns.
- Station Road will be closed from the junction with Warwick Road to the access to the parking at Abbey End / the Waitrose service entrance.
   This will create space for pedestrians to circulate safely in this area.
- Some planters on Warwick Road are being relocated to assist with social distancing.

A pedestrian one-way system is being introduced near to Sainsbury's due to the narrow footpath in this location.

## 8. Items and Correspondence for Consideration and Decision

- 8.1. **Convene** Meeting and document management system Discussion regarding the functionality and price, £1,000 per annum, of the system. Advantages regarding embedding documents within agenda, concerns expressed regarding the proportion of the Parish Councils revenue it would cost. Cllr Henderson to discuss potential for prolonging trial period.
- 8.2. **Village Hall Playground re-opening** Playground inspection report Carried out in advance of playground reopening. The report was read and considered and a full schedule of minor works proposed for Spring 2021, unless regular inspections identified an significant deteriorations. Low risk overall and playground now re-opened. Cllr Manley undertook to shear off the protruding bolts.

Concerns raised about trip hazard noted adjoining the swings. It was **RESOLVED** for clerk to contact Fairways request to rectify. Weekly visual check and quarterly full inspections re carried out.

- 8.3. **The Boot** Farmers Market. After concerns expressed regarding the safety measures of the first market, second had been far more satisfactory and advice sought from WDC /Police no further action. Query re change of use, Cllr Illingworth advised that change of use was only required in in excess of 28 days per year.
- 8.4. **Traffic Monitoring** Traffic monitoring equipment range of options, solar, fixed, portable and range of prices. Cllrs to consider after traffic calming 'qates' had been installed.
- 8.5. **Parish On-line** Agreed to undertake a 90 day free trial, potential cost of circa £200 per annum.

### 9. Progress Reports

- 9.1. **Lapworth Volunteers** monthly update will continue to be sent out even though activities diminishing. Number of cases reduced in local area but there is still potential for a second wave. Over £500 raised from mask sales and mask wearing is to be promoted, over 100 left in stock. 300 prescription deliveries, small number of shopping trips still be carried out. Food collections being undertaken. Thanks extended to all who were supporting the volunteer initiative.
- 9.2. **Community Speedwatch update** Cllr Doyle advised PCSO Ed King is handing responsibility to PCSO Pete Groom but no further action being taken at this time.
- 9.3. **Lapworth Train Station phone box** being used as a donation station
- 9.4. Millennium Sign defer
- 9.5. **Lapworth Canal Signage** Cllr Doyle advised a commitment had been made by the advertising agency to complete the signage by the end of summer.
- 9.6. **Social Media Considerations** photography competition deadline extended to 31st August 2020 Cllr Doyle to promote competition via posters on notice boards. Discussions taking place with the school regarding creating a logo and imagery for social media. Cllr Doyle proposed using newsletter 1<sup>st</sup> August to volunteers to promote alternative initiatives for volunteering, such as walking groups, ICT awareness and a Youth Council. Mindful of GDPR an alternative mailing list of those interested could be compiled.
